General Class Program-Presentation Topics

100 Level Courses

- GEC 101 Youth Protection- This training is a must for any registered scout leader and is a requirement on all tour permits, local or national, and is also mandatory for Quality Unit Award.
- GEC 102 Let's talk Uniforming- learn about the uniform and what, where and how to place insignia and other patches
- GEC 103 Recharter for Everyone- What is rechartering and why it is important to your unit. This class will help you through the steps. For Unit Committee Chairs and members as well as any leader with questions.
- GEC 104 Over the Top with Advanced Training- This class will be an informative session on what might be next for you after leader specific. Woodbadge, Powderhorn and National Training School opportunities will be some of the information found in this class.

200 Level Courses

- GEC 201 Climb On Safely- For any Boy Scout, Venturing or Varsity Leader including Committee Members. Any unit that wants to climb or rappel is required to have at least One trained leader to have a tour permit signed.
- GEC 202A/
202B Safe Swim/ Safety Afloat- This is a two session block for certification that is needed to take your unit swimming or on any on the water activity.
- GEC 203 Flag Etiquette-learn proper flag respect in this class as well as how to conduct a flag ceremony. For any Scouter who is new to this or needs to brush up on their flag knowledge
- GEC 204 Program Planning and How-To Pay For It- Is there something you want your unit to do?? Come to this session and get some ideas on what resources are there for you to tap into and/or if it is fundraising time. Some brainstorming possible in this class
- GEC 205 Planning the Big Event-Are you wanting to put on a CampORee or CubORee? Is there something else that trips your trigger? This class will help you learn what steps to take to make it happen.

300 Level Courses

- GEC 301 **Order of the Arrow and how it can benefit your Troop-** What is Order of the Arrow? Come to this session and we will tell you what the boys can gain from this Honor. This is a program for boys in the Boy Scout, Venturing or Varsity units.
- GEC 302 **Tribe of Lone Bear and how it can benefit your Troop-**What is Tribe of Lone Bear? If you are a Troop leader come to this session and we will tell you what the boys can gain from this program.

100 Level Courses

- VSC-101 **Crew Advisor-** Who runs the Venturing crew? Why of a crew? How does the crew differ from the Troop? What is the real job of the adult advisor? (THIS IS NOT LEADER SPECIFICS TRAINING)
- VSC-102 **Co-Ed Crews/Working with Teens-** It's tough to understand teens at times. This session should shed some light on adolescent developmental issues and involve a discussion of the dynamics and challenges of the co-ed crew

200 Level Courses

- VSC-201 **Teen Leaders' Council-** Learn what this group does and how your crew and you as an adult crew advisor can support it
- VSC-202 **Orienteering-** This is a basic map and compass class. If you just aren't quite
(BSC-204) confident in basic orienteering this is a class for you. **Please bring your own compass**

300 Level Courses

- VSC-301 **GPS-** If you can orient a map with a compass and want to learn GPS, then run to this
(BSC-306) class and be ready to have some fun. This session will show you what to look for in a GPS unit as well as learning about geocaching

For Venturers 14-20

VLSC-- (Venturing Leadership Skills Course) This is an all day course for Venturers designed to help teach young adults the attitudes and skills that good leaders demonstrate. Designed for youth 14-20 years of age.

100 Level Courses

- BCS 101 **Beginning Knots** – Learn how to tie and teach the basic knots needed through First Class in scouting.
- BCS 102 **Reptile and Amphibian Study** – Class for beginning scouts that teaches these nature skills needed through First Class in scouting.
- BSC 103 **Plant and Mammal Study** – Class for beginning scouts that teaches these nature skills needed through First Class in scouting.
- BSC 104 **Scouting and Conservation** – Working with your Conservation Department to come up with some nifty community service ideas and projects
- BSC 105 **Leave No Trace** – A Leave No Trace awareness seminar for both backcountry and frontcountry use
- BSC 106 **Merit Badge Councilor** – This Class covers the duties and responsibilities of a Merit Badge Councilor

- BSC 201 **Advanced Knots** – Advanced knot tying for adventurous scouts

- BSC 205 **Games** – Scouting is fun with a purpose. This seminar addresses games that will help make learning fun
- BSC 206 **Scoutmaster Conference and Boards of Review** – This seminar discusses the how to conduct the Scoutmaster Conference and Board of Review from Tenderfoot through Eagle.
- BSC 207 **Backpacking** – This seminar gives an introduction into using backpacking in your unit.

300 Level Courses

- BSC 301 **Scoutmaster/Senior Patrol Leader Relations** – This seminar discusses the patrol method and how the important relationship between the SM and SPL drives the boy led troop
- BSC 302 **Advanced Backpacking** – This seminar goes in to the latest in light weight backpacking techniques and gadgets.
- BSC 303 **Dutch Oven Cooking** – This is a course for beginners (3 hour course) limit 8 scouters.
- BSC 304 **Scoutmaster Minute** – This seminar discusses how perform and maximize the scoutmaster minute and will give examples
- BSC 305 Winter Camping – This seminar discusses winter camping techniques needed to take your troop camping in the winter safely***
- BCS-306 **GPS**-- If you can orient a map with a compass and want to learn GPS, (VSC-301) then run to this class and be ready for some fun. This session will show you what to look for in a GPS unit as well as learn about geocaching
