What is Wood Badge?

In 1911 Lord Baden-Powell began training Scouting's adult leaders by organizing a series of lectures. In 1919, these lectures became the basis for Wood Badge.

The primary purpose of Wood Badge has always been to strengthen Scouting in our units, districts, and local councils.

Since 1919, Wood Badge has continued to evolve to meet Scouting's needs. Wood Badge for the 21st Century has been developed for Cub Scout, Boy Scout, Varsity Team, Explorer Post and Venturing Crew leaders, as well as council and district level volunteers. Its focus is on leadership, rather than outdoor skills.

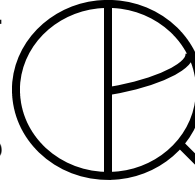
The first weekend includes presentations and activities that simulate the transition from the 5th Grade Webelos Scout program into a lifelong Boy Scout Experience. It focuses on three weeks of troop meetings and activities. The second weekend parallels a Scout troop's method and structure for an exciting and challenging weekend campout experience.

Leaders of ALL programs should attend. It is encouraged that everyone attend within the first two years of service.

Attendance Qualifications

1. Be a registered member of the Boy Scouts of America. (No minimum tenure requirements)
2. Participate in all sessions of the course, ALL DAY on Friday, Saturday and Sunday (both sessions), and an interim patrol meeting.
3. Have not previously attended Wood Badge for the 21st Century.
4. Have completed the basic training courses for their Scouting Position
5. Have completed the outdoor skills training programs appropriate to their Scouting Position
6. Successfully complete an Annual Health and Medical Record (replaces Class 1, 2, & 3 health forms).
